

RECORD BREAKING EXAMINATION RESULTS - THE UPPER SIXTH SHINE !

All three year groups achieved excellent results at GCSE, AS and A Levels this summer. Pride of place must go to the Upper Sixth who established two new school records.

A Level Results:

It was a record breaking year with 32.1 of A Levels (excluding General Studies) being passed at A* grade and 90.6% A*/B. The figure of 71.8% was close to the existing school record (set in 2008). 56 pupils achieved at least one A* grade. Thirteen pupils achieved three A* grades, two achieved 4A* grades, seven achieved 4A* grades and an A grade and one student, Serge Wicker an astonishing 5A* grades. The percentage A* result placed the school fifth in the national league tables for state schools (published by the Times newspaper) and for this criteria this was the best result for any King Edward Foundation School !

AS Results:

After achieving our record GCSE results in 2010, the Lower Sixth maintained the quality of their performance in public examinations even though the year group is the largest the school has had in the Sixth Form. Some 82 students achieved at least 3 A grades, 56 at least 4 grades and 29 at least 5 A grades at AS Level or above.

There were, of course, some outstanding performances. Tom Dowling and Alex McCormick achieved 6 A grades at AS Level. Kieran Ahern, Joseph Hackett, Peter Liu, John Lutwyche, Bassit Malik, Oliver Palmer, Asim Shoaib, Ben Smith, Hasaam Uldin and Chris Williams all achieved 5 A grades at AS Level. Jared Dunn, Alan Egan, Stephen Foulkes, Michael Grace, Oliver Leon, Michael Liu, George Mather, Michael Soley, Andrew Soltan, Dwayne Spiteri, Alexander Wood, Luke Pritchard Cairns, David Wen and George Zeng all achieved 4 A grades at AS Level and an A* grade in Mathematics at A Level. Dominik Brundler, Ben Dovey, Alex Pattison and Wai-Ming Yap all achieved 4 A grades at AS Level and an A grade at A Level Mathematics.

GCSE Results:

This large year group (for Camp Hill Boys) achieved another set of outstanding GCSE results.

82.3% of all GCSE's were at A*/A grades and a staggering **54.9%** were at A* grade. Four students (Sam Archer, Benson Cheng, Talay Cheema and Robert McDonald) achieved 11 A* straight grades, five (Zaid Al-Shammary, Osama Hamid, Faheem Malik, Adnan Mohammad and Sanjay Nath) achieved 10 straight A* grades, four (Kameran Ali, Ajinkya Bhalerao, Ajay Dhunna and Kuran Rati) achieved 10A*'s and one A grade.

Forty six out of a year group of one hundred and two achieved straight A*/A grades. 89 pupils achieved at least 5A*/A grades (87 in 2010 and 84 in 2009). These results meant that the school was prominent, once again, by being ranked tenth place for %A* and eighteenth for %A*/A for state schools (published by the Times newspaper).
