

## RECORD BREAKING EXAMINATION RESULTS – ONCE AGAIN !

### A Level Results:

It has been, in fact, a record breaking year with **32.1%** of A Levels (excluding General Studies) being passed at **A\*** grade and **91.6% A\*/B**. The figure of 71.2% A\*/A was close to the existing school record (set in 2008). Some 65 pupils achieved at least one A\* grade. Fifteen students achieved three A\* grades, four achieved 4A\* grades, four achieved 4A\* grades and an A grade and one student, Andrew Soltan, an astonishing 5A\* grades and 1 A grade. 63 boys achieved straight A\*/A grades at A Level, 103 boys achieved at least AAB grades (excluding General Studies).

The percentage A\* result placed the school fifth in the national league tables for state schools (published by the Times newspaper). All twenty students receiving offers achieved entry into Oxford and Cambridge – another school record. 96 students achieved entry into their first choice university and 6 into their second choice university.

### AS Results:

After achieving excellent GCSE results in 2011, the Lower Sixth maintained the quality of their performance in public examinations even though the year group is the largest the school has had in the Sixth Form (130 compared to 127 last year). There were, of course, some outstanding individual performances:

- Zakariya Ahmad, Kameran Ali, Haroon Amjad, Damien Carroll, Ajay Dhunna, Joe Dutton, Howard Jones, Faheem Malik, Adnan Mohammad, Daniel Price, Abdul Samad, Ahmed Ud-Din, Nicholas Wilson and Talha Witten all achieved 5 A grades at AS. Jan Lietava and Sanjay Nath both achieved 5 A grades and 1 B grades in their AS Levels.
- Talay Cheema, Benson Cheng, Xiaoyuan Li, Robert McDonald, Tom Perkins, Oliver Tonks, Xincheng Wang, Ajinkya Bhalerao, Sam Childs, Jacob Deasy, Michael Duffy, Sumant Kapoor, Patrick Pritty, James Seaward, Jack Yates and Kuran Rati all achieved 4 A grades at AS Level and an A\* grade in Mathematics at A Level.
- Jason Pereira, Qasim Ali, Ahmad Khattab and Rowan May all achieved 4 A grades at AS Level and an A grade at A Level Mathematics.

Some 87 students achieved at least 3 A grades, 62 at least 4 A grades and 24 at least 5 A grades at AS Level or above.

### GCSE Results:

This year achieved another excellent set of GCSE results. **85.4%** of all GCSE's were at A\*/A grades and a staggering **54.3%** were at A\* grade. One student (Jaskaran Rajput) achieved 11 A\* grades, seven (Andrew Hawkin, Idris Mohammed, Thomas Murphy, Ali Nathani, Alexander Lloyd, Narinder Phull, Kyle Reed and Charlie Song) achieved 10 straight A\* grades, one (Adersh Saravanaa) achieved 10A\*'s and one A grade. Seventy six out of a year group of ninety one achieved straight A\*/A grades. 84 students in the year group achieved at least 5A\*/A grades (90 in 2011, 87 in 2010 and 84 in 2009).

These results meant that the school was prominent, once again, by being ranked seventh place for %A\* and thirteenth for %A\*/A for state schools (published by the Times newspaper).
