

Doing

Join an extracurricular group such as Art Club or Animation Club

Visit a local or national art gallery (see the list below)

Take part in Sketchbook Circle

Visit Tate Gallery 'Walk through British Art' to get a sense of British Art history

Make your own sketchbook using lots of different kinds of paper.

Challenge yourself to draw as much as possible from observation. Buy a small sketchbook and try to make a drawing/sketch/painting/collage every day for two weeks. This could be a quick 5 minute study to one hour. Show your art teacher your art work

YouTube Tutorials by Sarah Graham

Clubs change at various points during the year so check with your teacher what is on and when

Explore and look at the work – make quick sketches and take part in any free activities that are available
