

### COMICS.









#### 1. Astérix et Obélix by René Goscinny and Albert Uderzo.

The comics are heavy in French humour, which will help all learners understand French style and colloquial phrases, as well as social criticism.

#### 2. Tintin by Hergé.

The fantastic drawings, wit and socio-political commentary make for a visually engaging and appetizing read. These comics are very helpful for all key stages.

#### 3. Lucky Luke.

Set in the American Old West, this series follows the life of Lucky Luke, a cowboy known for his ability to shoot faster than the wind. It sits somewhere between affectionate parody and a tribute to the Old West, focusing on the theme of right vs. wrong and inevitably culminating in some sort of rescue mission.

#### 4. Spirou et Fantasio.

The series follows the two eponymous friends as they get involved in a number of adventures. Aided by their pet squirrel and inventor friend the Count of Champignac, the two main characters get involved in their fair share of trouble and intrigue. If you like adventure, this is the series for you.

#### 5. Boule et Bill.

Boule, a little boy, and Bill, a lively cocker spaniel, are inseparable. They play with their friends, they fool around, and have quite normal adventures in the suburb where they live with Bill's parents.

#### 6. Gaston Lagaffe.

Gaston works at *Le Journal de Spirou*. *Work* is a bit of a stretch though. Gaston is simply... extremely lazy. And any task he is given has a tendency to linger.

But Gaston is not completely useless. He is in fact, a brilliant inventor. Even if not many people understand his inventions.

#### 7. Titeuf.
