The future is HYBRID

- Recent shift in employment is the emergence of [Hybrid Jobs](#)
- Essentially, it means that something is a mixture of separate things
- Professions which once relied solely on STEM skills (such as coding, programming, data analysis) now also need soft skills (such as creative thinking and design)
- Arts based subjects develop these skills - such as analysis, design, or marketing

Your GCSE choices and your Career

- Choose options which you enjoy and are good at
- Only a few careers require specific option subjects for example:
 - architecture – art and/or DT 3D design
 - Sound engineer – music and DT electronic
- RS is very useful for medically related professions – medical ethics

Camp Hill Boys Common destinations

- 25-35 students study Medicine and Healthcare related degrees
- 15-20 choose from a range of Science disciplines
- 10-12 students study Engineering related courses
- 5-10 students choose Economics
- 4-6 went go into Accounting and Finance courses
- The remainder chose subjects as diverse as Product Design, English Literature, History, Psychology, Law, Economics, Liberal Arts and Philosophy, Fine Art
- 2-3 Degree Apprentiships

New Degree Apprenticeships started September 2015

Apprentices split their time between university study and the workplace and are employed throughout

- Gain a full bachelor's or master's degree from a top university
- Earn a wage
- And get on-the-job experience in their chosen profession
- No tuition fees or loans
- Law, Accountancy, Police, Engineering, Microbiology etc

- My friends are doing the subject **Good or Bad?**

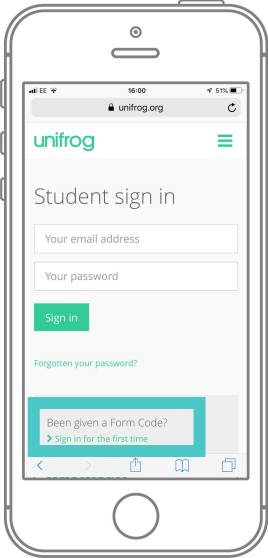
