Exam Results 2018 – Congratulations to our boys who have done themselves proud

Well done the GCSE and A Level classes of 2018.

GCSE

- More than 8 out of 10 results (81%) were at grades 7-9 (the old A*/A grades).
- The Attainment 8 figure for the school was 81. In other words, on average, each student achieved the equivalent of 10 of the new grade 8s.
- The estimated Progress 8 figure was an astonishing 0.74; that means that, on average, boys at Camp Hill performed three quarters of a grade better in every GCSE they took than boys of a similar Key Stage 2 ability across the country.
- According to The Times, only twelve state schools in the country did better at GCSE (grades 7-9 or grades 8-9) than Camp Hill.

A Level

- More than two-thirds (67%) of A Levels were passed at grade A or A*; more than a quarter (28%) were at A*.
- 11 boys got A*s in all their A Levels (three of these sat 3 A Levels, seven sat 4, one sat 5).
- According to The Times, just 8 state schools in the country had better (A*%) A Level results than Camp Hill.

Other successes

- 29 boys won places to study medicine a new school record (following the record number 26 – last year).
- One boy represented the UK in the team of 4 in the International Chemistry Olympiad in the Czech Republic/Slovakia. He returned with a silver medal. (This is the third consecutive year we have sent a boy to the Chemistry Olympiad two silver and a bronze.)
