Exam Results 2019 - Congratulations to our boys who have done themselves proud

Well done the GCSE and A Level classes of 2019.

GCSE

- Nearly 9 out of 10 results (89%) were at grades 7-9 (the old A*/A grades).
- The Attainment 8 figure for the school was 77. (In other words the average grade was 7.7).
- The estimated Progress 8 figure was 0.6; that means that, on average, boys at Camp Hill performed more than half a grade better in every GCSE they took than boys of a similar Key Stage 2 ability across the country.
- According to The Times, only five state schools in the country did better at GCSE (grades 8-9) than Camp Hill (no schools north of Watford!).

A Level

- Nearly two-thirds (64%) of A Levels were passed at grade A or A*; more than a quarter (30%) were at A*.
- 11 boys got A*s in all their A Levels (three of these sat 3 A Levels, eight sat 4).
- According to The Times, just 8 state schools in the country had better (A*%) A Level results than Camp Hill.

Other successes

- 24 boys won places to study medicine
- 13 boys won places at Oxford or Cambridge
- One boy represented the UK in the team of 4 in the International Chemistry Olympiad in Paris. He returned with a silver medal. (This is the fourth consecutive year we have sent a boy to the Chemistry Olympiad three silvers and a bronze.)
