GCSE Results 2025 – An Overview

Our 2025 GCSE results reflect an important period of change for the school and our wider community. Following a change to the Academy Trust's admissions policy in 2020, the academic starting points of students joining the school shifted significantly. As this cohort reached Year 11, this change has naturally influenced overall attainment outcomes this summer.

While headline attainment figures are lower than in previous years, students' progress remains exceptionally strong. Our internal analysis shows a residual score of **+0.86**, meaning that, on average, students achieved nearly a full grade higher per subject than their starting points would predict. This continues our long-standing record of adding significant value to every student's education.

We are proud of the resilience, commitment and ambition shown by our students, and we congratulate them warmly on their achievements. Alongside this, A-level outcomes in 2025 are our strongest since the pandemic, reflecting the continued academic strength and high expectations across the school.

We remain firmly committed to supporting every student to fulfil their potential, whatever their starting point, and to building on these strong foundations in the years ahead.

- 7 out of 10 results (70%) were at grades 7-9 (the old A*/A grades).
- The Attainment 8 figure for the school was 76 (In other words the average grade was 7.6).
- The Progress 8 estimate was 0.86
- 2 students achieved all grade 9's.
- 14 students achieved all grades 9 or 8.

A Level

- 6 out of 10 (64%) of A Levels were passed at grade A or A*.
- 21 students got A*s in all their A Levels

Other achievements

- 38 students won places to study medicine
- 14 students won places to study engineering
- 12 students won places to study computer Science
- 12 students won places at Oxford or Cambridge
